Informal

Some people do well in a formal church structure. Others prefer a more relaxed setting.

Gathering

Ideally, at least two families or small groups come together in a House Fellowship (remember, the key word is Fellowship). A House Fellowship is not instead of church, but church on a smaller, friendly scale.

People

A house fellowship is not about a house, or even technology, but people. The people who most enjoy a House Fellowship are those who want to use their home as a place of ministry for friends and neighbors, as well as those who feel comfortable in a home worship setting.

Home

There's no place like home, because a home is...homey. A House Fellowship usually involves a gracious host and a welcoming venue that will accommodate up to 25 people. Sometimes there are even snacks!

Participating

One of the benefits of worshipping in a home is the interactivity it affords among attendees. To encourage active participation, weekly handouts, discussion questions, and House Fellowship materials are available for download. Song sheets can also be requested via email.

Services

All the worship services of CTK Burlington are broadcast live over the internet. During each service House Fellowship participants are welcomed prior to the teaching, and included in the closing Q&A via email and text message.

Internet
